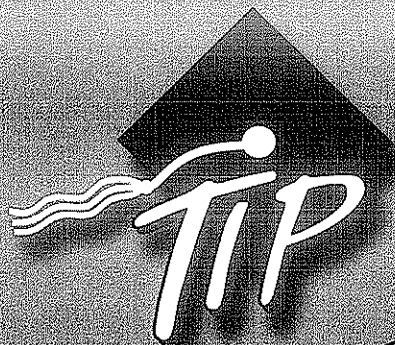


Tuition Incentive Program



Eligibility

To be eligible for the Tuition Incentive Program (TIP), a student must have received Medicaid coverage for 24 months within a 36-month period between the ages of 9 and high school graduation. The Michigan Department of Human Services (DHS) determines which students are Medicaid eligible and transmits this information to the Michigan Department of Treasury.

Eligibility Checklist

- Received Medicaid coverage for 24 months within a 36-month period between the ages of 9 and high school graduation.
- Completed and returned application (via phone or postal mail) to SSG before high school graduation or GED and before age 20.
- Must be a Michigan resident and a U.S. citizen, permanent resident or approved refugee.

Application

Once identified as having met the Medicaid coverage requirement, Student Scholarships and Grants (SSG) will send the student an application. The student MUST return the completed form (via phone or postal mail) to SSG before graduating from high school with a diploma, a certificate of completion, or obtaining a GED. The student MUST do both of these before their 20th birthday.

TIP Phase I Covers:

- The cost of tuition credit hours at the current in-district rate at participating Michigan community colleges.
- The cost of tuition credit hours at the lower level resident rate at participating Michigan public universities.
- The average community college rate per credit hour is available at participating degree-granting independent non-profit colleges, federally tribally-controlled colleges, or Focus: HOPE. Contact SSG for the current academic year rate.
- Mandatory fees up to \$250 per semester/term.

TIP Phase II Covers:

- Tuition and mandatory fees not to exceed \$500 per semester or \$400 per term up to a maximum of \$2,000 for credits earned in a four-year program.
- Must be used within 30 months of Phase I completion.

| <p><u>Community Colleges</u></p> | <p>Eligible charges include current in-district tuition and mandatory fees. For persons residing in an area that is not included in any community college district, the out-of-district tuition rate may be authorized. Some community colleges are authorized to offer bachelor's degrees. Contact your institution to see how this may impact your TIP eligibility.</p> | |
| <p><u>Public Universities</u></p> | <p>Eligible charges include lower level resident tuition and mandatory fees for the current year. Reminder: The student must be enrolled in an associate degree program to be eligible for TIP Phase I benefits.</p> | |
| <p><u>Independent Colleges and Universities</u></p> | <p>Eligible charges include mandatory fees for the current year and a per credit payment that does not exceed the average community college in-district per credit tuition rate. Reminder: The student must be enrolled in an associate degree program to be eligible for TIP Phase I benefits.</p> | |
