In addition, freshmen explore more about themselves through interest and personality inventories, sophomores focus on postsecondary planning/college exploration, juniors learn to document their accomplishments through letters of recommendation questionnaires, college/job applications, and resumes, and seniors learn about interviewing and experience mock interviews.
